They'll join the Pink Palace's existing 23 couture cottages, which have long seduced Liz Taylor, who honeymooned with six of her eight hubbies in the luxe love shacks. Each of the not-so-humble new abodes boasts three bedrooms and three and a half baths, as well as a chef's kitchen, great room, study, private gardens, patios, outdoor shower and waterfall-edged swimming pool. Behind a wroughtiron gate inspired by the hotel's iconic banana leaf wallpaper, look for a palm tree homage by Claes Oldenburg and bathroom vanities Joan Crawford would have loved, not to mention fireplaces

in every room (outside too). All of this was envisioned by architect and designer Lauren Rottet. whose furnishing selections—'30sinspired chandeliers, '40s-inspired sofasare meant to dovetail with the hotel's overall vibe. "It's like no other place in the world," she says. Lost to construction is the property's seldom utilized pair of tennis courts.
